CHECKLIST

Consult with a surrogacy attorney

Even within the U.S., different states have different laws. Your attorney can help you understand how surrogacy is handled in that state, alerting you to any potential issues that should be addressed as the journey progresses.

Create a surrogacy agreement

In California and many other states, both parties must be represented by their own (separate) attorneys throughout the entire surrogacy process. In California, the surrogacy agreement must be signed and notarized before the surrogate starts injectable medication

Create a Parental Establishment Process (Judgment of Parentage)

This is a court order officially documenting that you are the legal parents of the child born through surrogacy. In some states, you can obtain this order before the child is born; in others, you will need to wait until after the birth.

Ensure the Birth Certificate is Accurate

Review your child's birth certificate and make any necessary amendments.

Obtain Travel Documents and Apostille (if Necessary)

After the baby is born, you will need to pick up the birth certificate and apply for a passport for your child. Plan for this to take at least a month to prepare. Also, consult with your attorney to see if the country your baby was born in requires any legal documents or needs to be Apostilled by the Secretary of State.
